Creating Musicians—One Student at a Time



The teachers and coordinators of the MusicLink Foundation realize the significance of this simple statement every time a link is made between an eager young child and a dedicated teacher. We hear a lot of buzz about branding and twitter feeds and quick fixes—but MusicLink teachers know that musicians are developed by a lasting relationship between a teacher and student over years of instruction. Indeed, MusicLink creates musicians, as witnessed by the success stories of our graduating seniors (refer to our June eLINK), and our research showing 99% of MusicLink students attend college. Remember, all of our MusicLink students are in financial need; however, the talent and dedication that emerges through

MusicLink lessons often help them gain scholarship assistance to college.

We thank all of our donors who have supported us over the past 23 years and hope you will consider extending and possibly expanding your support as we seek to set a fund-raising goal of raising \$7,500 over the next two months (Nov.–Dec.) to help the organization extend our teacher and student enrollment. Our teachers donate in-kind instruction equivalent to \$700,000 annually, with our overall total instructional scholarship exceeding \$11 million dollars. We hold expenses down through our partnerships with businesses and through community donations of instruments. The foundation provides camp scholarships, teacher reimbursement grants, grass roots grants, and assistance with instruments as well as ongoing networking by our coordinators to grow our teacher base and student possibilities. What better way to

secure music in a child's life than to recognize and support what we do through the MusicLink Foundation?

We are pleased to see growing interest in our MusicLink Legacy Partner program, with donors pledging annual donations of \$5,000 (Bravo Tier) to \$10,000 (Encore Tier) to guarantee sustaining our basic annual operations of \$80,000 to \$100,000. 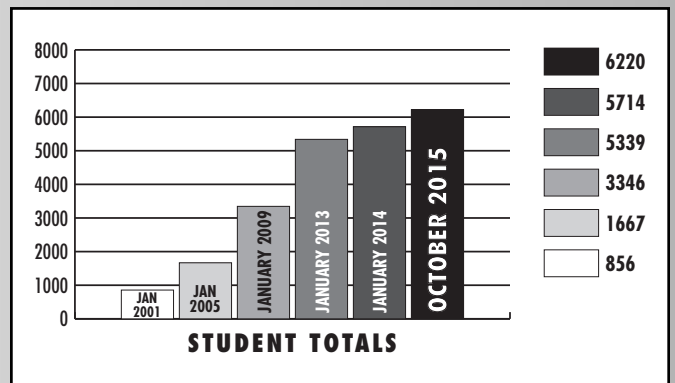
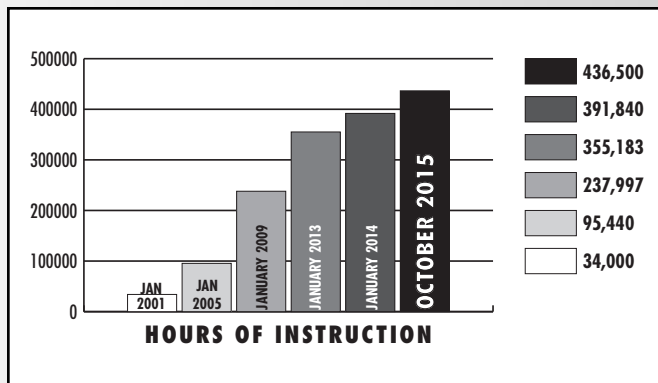
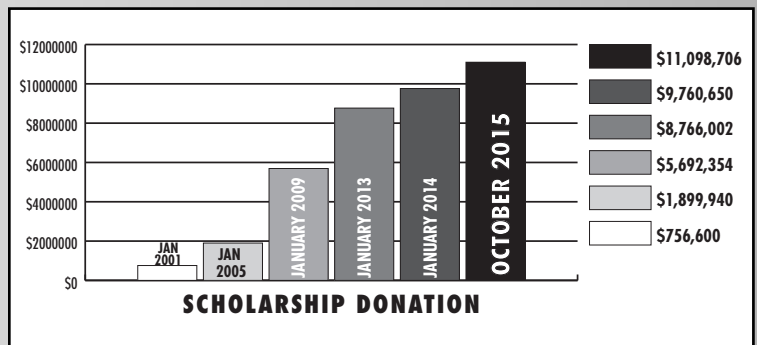

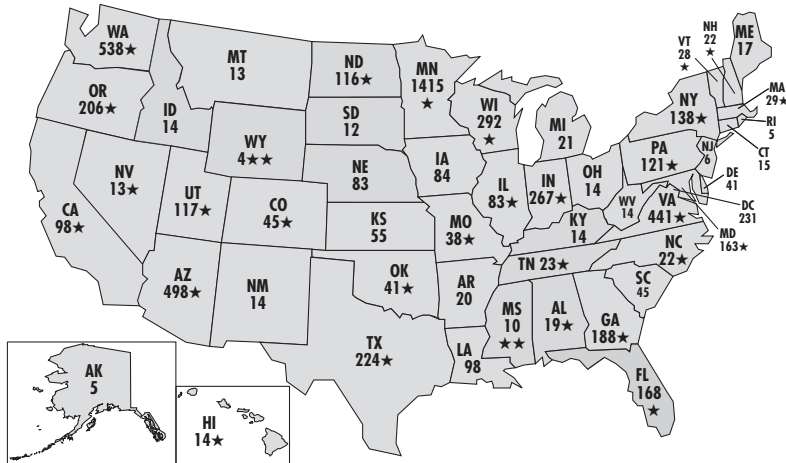
MUSICLINK FOUNDATION STATUS REPORT

SENIOR AWARD WINNER: Emily Brother of Portland OR was awarded the MusicLink Senior Award of Excellence, which recognizes a graduating senior who has shown outstanding musical progress and commitment through years of MusicLink lessons. The \$1000 award is provided by the Arline and Russell Bridge Endowment Fund.

Emily studied piano with Dorothy Fahlman for six years and has won numerous competitions including the MTNA Oregon State and Northwest Division Competitions in Senior Piano for 2015. She also is a two-time winner of the Young Artists Debut! Van Buren Concerto Competition for 2013 and 2015. Emily will attend Harvard University and plans to continue her music studies through the New England Conservatory of Music. "Whatever career goals I set in the coming years, my overarching life aspiration is to achieve a professional level of pianistic maturity. Although there may be a limit on the number of musicians who win international competitions, there will never be a limit on the number of pianists that can perform with an acute level of sensitivity, insight, passion and depth. I will be most satisfied if that is the level of playing that I achieve."

FUND RAISING EVENTS ACROSS THE COUNTRY

Combining music-making with "kids helping kids" not only helps bring needed funds to MusicLink, but provides a way for students to perform for others in their communities. The MusicLink Foundation received a total of nearly \$16,800 from all of these wonderful events.

IL CLAVINOVA FESTIVAL: Deborah Meier, our Illinois MusicLink coordinator, worked closely with the Gateway Arch East MTA and Steve Trawford of Piano Distributors in Fairview Heights to hold their annual Clavinova Festival. 27 students

performed, raising \$500 for the MusicLink Foundation, with one lucky student winning a Yamaha digital keyboard.

IL PROMISE TO PRACTICE: The MTNA student chapter of Western Illinois University held their fourth annual Promise to Practice week, with music majors gathering pledges for their practice hours during one week. Our thanks to Vice President Amy Broadbent, who organized the event. A wonderful way to make those practice hours count and raise \$455 for our MusicLink kids!

IA PROMISE TO PRACTICE: Yes, a single teacher in a single studio can make a difference for MusicLink. Dr. Elaine Burns had 20 students practice to reach a goal in December and raised \$345 for MusicLink. Students who raised over \$100 received tote bags and all students received mini-flashlights.

VA HOLIDAY FUNDRAISER: The Fairfax-Loudoun Music Fellowship once again held a fundraiser for MusicLink at the Dulles Town Center. 141 students performed for mall shoppers and raised \$2,000 for the MusicLink Foundation. Our thanks to Sandra Baker and participating teachers for organizing this annual event.

VA BENEFIT CONCERT: The Celebration Singers once again raised funds through their concert season, contributing \$615 to the MusicLink Foundation by having a contribution basket available to the audience at each concert venue.

NY HOLIDAY FUNDRAISER: Faust Harrison Piano Store in Melville again hosted a MusicLink fundraiser featuring students of three studios, organized by Patricia Cestaro. The students raised \$845 for the MusicLink Foundation.

MN MUSICLINK PLAYATHON: The Minnesota MusicLink Playathon took place at the Mall of America in February, 2015, raising over \$10,000. It was an amazing event, with 244 performers from the studios of 48 teachers. This annual event is organized by Sue Wege, MusicLink Director of Coordinators, working with many teacher members of Minnesota Music Teachers Association.

MN HARD ROCK CAFÉ: In celebration of the opening of a new Hard Rock Café at the Mall of America in October 2014, the Hard Rock Café International organization donated \$1,500 to the MusicLink Foundation.

MN PEDALING FOR PIANOS: The Minnesota MusicLink program teamed up with the Keys 4/4 Kids organization to raise money to purchase practice keyboards for MusicLink students. Keys 4/4 Kids has placed pianos around the city for performance opportunities. The bikers stopped at several sites to rest and enjoy musical performances and received gift cards donated by local businesses. The event, organized by Eric Bell, raised \$530 for the MusicLink Foundation.

MUSICLINK RECOGNITION



The National Conference of Keyboard Pedagogy invited the MusicLink Foundation to present an informative session at their July 2015 conference. Executive Director Joanne Haroutounian was joined by MusicLink Teacher of Distinction Peggy Newhall, who shared her years of personal experience in the program. The event included a performance by students of Phyllis Calderon, a Chicago-based MusicLink teacher.

The MusicLink Foundation has once again been recognized as one of the 2015 top-rated non profit organization by great-nonprofits.org. We welcome reviews by readers, teachers, parents, and supporters on their website to continue this status.

TEACHER REIMBURSEMENT & GRASS ROOTS GRANTS

The MusicLink Foundation provides reimbursement to teachers for student music and event fees. This year, 16 teachers from 9 states received reimbursements totaling \$1,218.

Our Grass Roots Grant program assists new MusicLink programs or projects. This year the foundation awarded grants totaling \$800 to the Minnesota MTA and Oregon MTA to assist with their MusicLink programs.
